

Life Lessons with Bluey

Bluey is an Australian children's show about talking dogs, but adults love it too! I like it because it's **authentic**. It's set in Brisbane; near my **hometown**. The **voice actors** are Australian, so the **accents** are perfect! It has many **familiar** things, words, and places for me. It has short **episodes** with **simple** English. I think it's perfect for **foreigners** to learn about Australia. I hope you'll try the show! Today I'll tell you about episodes that teach **helpful** life **lessons**.

The Creek- be brave!

Pass the Parcel- Don't be a sore loser





Bingo plays 'Pass the Parcel' at **birthday** parties. You sit in a circle & pass a present around while music plays. When the music stops, the kid holding the present unwraps one layer. **Only** one person can win the big **prize** in the last **layer**. Bingo cries & cries when she loses. Then, at each party, she gets a little **better** at losing. She sees how happy her friends are when they win, & learns to have fun **whether** she wins or loses. When she **finally** wins, her friends are happy for her! I played this game as a kid, but my mum put **mini** prizes like lollipops in each layer. There was only 1 big **winner**, but everyone got something.

Copycat- Understanding difficult emotions

Bluey finds an **injured** bird while walking with her dad. They use a **shoebox** and **towel** to **safely** carry it to the **vet**. Everyone does their best to help, but **unfortunately**, the bird dies. The next day, Bluey and her sister Bingo **reenact** this. Bingo **pretends** to be the bird that died. Playing like this helps Bluey understand the difficult **emotions** she is feeling. This episode is a great example of why children & adults like Bluey. It teaches children about **mature** topics in a way they can understand.

Australia has many **native** animals, and we are very **respectful** of **wildlife**. I have found birds, **possums**, and wallabies injured like this near my house. I have done the same thing as Bluey; using a towel & shoebox to take animals to the vet. Of course, I can't **carry** a **wallaby**, so I called the **council** to ask for help that time. **Actually**, I don't know if those animals were ok after we left, but I **hope** they were.







The Decider- Choosing different sides, but still loving each other







Bluey watches **rugby** with her family & the **neighbours**. It's the State of Origin- a very **important** game! Every year the **Queensland** Maroons & the **New South Wales** Blues play 3 games- one each in May, June, & July. This year's **final** match is July 9th. Both teams have 1 win so far, so it will be the **decider**, like the episode!

I'm from Queensland, so I **support** the Maroons, like Bluey's family! Their neighbours are different though. The dad supports the Maroons, but the mum supports the Blues. They have a friendly **rivalry**. They yell **for** their team, and **against** the other one.

Their son can't **choose** a team. He doesn't want to **disappoint** his parents. They tell him it's ok to choose, so he picks the Maroons. He goes against his mum for now, but they **still** love each other. This is **realistic**, people are so passionate about State of Origin! My family wears Maroon jerseys, even our dogs! But my friend is like the neighbours. She was **born** in Queensland, but her parents are from New South Wales. They support **different** teams too.

In the end of the episode, the **son** is so happy to learn there is a Green & Gold team- the Australian team! Now the **whole** family supports the **same** team, against our rivals New Zealand.

Students use the English they've learnt in class, ask their host family for **help** when they don't know a word, and use gestures to **communicate**.

They visit the beach, the **bush**, a **zoo**, a **church**, the Sydney Opera House & Harbour **Bridge**... more places than I can **fit** photos of! Australia is known for beautiful **nature**, so I'm happy the girls get to see so much of it! And of course, our **unique** animals are so cute, I'm **sure** they love meeting them!

We visited a school, dressed in traditional clothes, and ate cultural food.














We saw the King's castle in Malaysia, then we travelled to Singapore and saw the Merlion.
