### Erin & Nene's Friendship Story

My friend Nene is Japanese, but she grew up in Australia. I'd like to tell you about our **friendship**! Nene moved from Osaka, Japan, to the Gold Coast, Australia when she was 6. We met in year 2 at Miami **Primary School**. We **quickly** became friends! We were in the same class from year 2 all the way to year 6. Year 7 was the first time we had ever been in different classes.





we were in different classes again. We finally had some classes together in our last 2 years. We were together in Japanese class, **Business** class, and **study** period **together**. There were many fun events in High School like running a business for a day, sports days, and visits to the beach next to school.

After high school, I went to Griffith University, & Nene took a gap year. She went home to Osaka and spent a year working at a souvenir shop in the Kansai airport. The next year, she joined me at University. We had 1 linguistics class, and 2 Chinese classes together. But now I have forgotten almost all my Chinese! One thing I remember is: 'This is my Japanese friend (这是我的日 本人朋友).' Nene also did a study abroad in Spain. How cool!





After University, I taught in Australia, and Nene worked a **few** different jobs. She worked at a shop called Miniso, at the Apple store, at a Japanese restaurant, she even worked as a **casino** game dealer. I moved to Japan in November, 2020. It was during corona, which was crazy! Nene moved here on the 17th of March, 2022- **Saint Patrick's Day**! Now, we both live in Tokyo! I teach English at Keika, and Nene works at a **translation** company.

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## **Interview with Nene**

# Please tell us about yourself, and when you first moved to Australia.

Hi, I'm Nene! I'm 27 years old, and I was born in Osaka Japan. However, I grew up in Australia! I moved there when I was 6. Erin was one of my first friends I made on the Gold Coast in grade 2. One of the very first memories I have is her and another girl inviting me to **hang out** at lunch time on my first day at Miami Primary School. I remember feeling very **relieved** that my classmates made me feel welcome. It meant a lot to me as I was in a new school, and a whole new country where I was not **familiar** with the **language** yet (English).



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#### Was it difficult to adapt to the Gold Coast?

I remember I cried most days before going to school for about the first 6 months. I don't remember very well now, but I think I was just very **nervous** and **uncertain**. My mum tells me that even though I was **emotional** for a while, I never cried about wanting to go back to Japan. I never hated my life on the Gold Coast, it just took some time for me to **adapt**.



#### Can you tell us about adapting to a new culture and language?

Surrounding myself with lots of local people definitely helped me adapt to a new culture and language faster. Some Asian families will choose a school that has a big community of Asian people and students there already. So that their child can feel comfortable, and like they belong. When my family moved, we just chose a school that was near our new house. I think there were maybe 2 other students in the whole school who were also Japanese, and they weren't in my grade. I think some kids who move to a new country might feel uncomfortable in an environment like that, but somehow, I was ok.



I think having amazing **classmates** like Erin making me feel **welcome** from day one helped me a lot. Also, because I moved at 6 years old, I didn't think about my **identity** or my **race**. I was just another kid. This made it easier for me to adapt without many **worries** or **anxiety**. I wasn't scared to **pronounce** things wrong as I learnt English. I felt **confident** in my **daily life**.



In our **senior** (4<sup>th</sup>) year, Andie and I did a Model **Organization of American States** (M.O.A.S.) Conference in the fall.
