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

To see all the **locations** from the movie, you will have to go on a **somewhat** long walk up the hill, and **climb** lots of stairs. All this walking will make you feel warm, so it might be easier to do in cold weather. When we went we wore winter coats, but had to take them off for part of our walk.

If you visit Seiseki Sakuragaoka in **winter**, you can see

When you arrive at the station, you will hear the famous song used in the movie: カントリーロード. A different part plays when trains arrive on either platform 1 or 2. The Japanese lyrics were made specially for this movie.

















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With a name like Sakuragaoka, of course this area will be beautiful in **spring! During** your walk up the hill you can see lots of cherry blossoms. You can take great pictures with the trees **framing** the town below. There are mostly white cherry blossoms here, but when you look up close, the inside **petals** are pink. When we came here in spring, my friend and I **recreated** the scene at the **shrine**. Of course, we didn't do the **love confession** part! We also got **fortunes**, and mine was very lucky!





In the movie, when you get to the top of the hill you can see Seiji's house- which is also an **antiques** shop. In real life, the house isn't there, but there are still Whisper of the Heart **themed** shops! You can find the third stamp here, and then relax at the bakery or the cafe. They both have themed food & lots of decorations. The owners are very kind, and can give **advice** to help you find other spots from the movie. At the cafe, you can look at messages from other **visitors**, and write your own too!















Finally, here is Seiseki Sakuragaoka in **summer!** A lot of the movie takes place during Shizuku's summer vacation, so if you want to be recreate the movie as closely as possible, you should visit in summer! Just make sure to wear **sunscreen** & a big hat, and bring some water to help **beat the heat!**
