Blood Typing The Chinese zodiac is from the Chinese **lunar** (moon) calendar. It is a cycle of 12 years with 12 animals. Each animal **represents** a year and an hour of the day. The animals in **order** are: rat/mouse, ox/cow, tiger, rabbit, dragon, snake, horse, sheep/ram/goat, monkey, rooster/bird, dog, and pig/boar.

So, YOU get an animal based on the year in which you were born. This system is very popular and **important** for many countries in Asia.



Western astrology gives each star **constellation** a name and **sign**. The signs in order are: Aries, Taurus, Gemini, Cancer, Leo, Virgo, Libra, Scorpio, Sagittarius, Capricorn, Aquarius, and Pisces.

Then YOU get a sign based on what month, day, and hour you were born. Of course, where **matters** too because of **time zones**. This system is very popular in Europe and the Americas.

What is Tarot?

The **Tarot** is a series of cards, **similar** to playing cards, which people use to answer **important** questions, try to **predict** the future, and just have fun. If you've ever read the manga or seen the anime Cardcaptor Sakura, then you'll know about Clow cards. Clow cards are **actually** based on Tarot cards!


There are seventy-eight cards in a Tarot **deck**: twenty-two **Major** Arcana Cards, and fifty-six **Minor** Arcana cards. The Major Arcana represent the big themes in life, such as 'The Lovers' for **romance**, and 'The Wheel of Fortune' for luck. Some of the Major Arcana seem scary, like 'Death', but the meanings are often less **frightening** than they seem. Like **playing cards**, the Minor Arcana are split into four groups, called suits. But instead of hearts, clubs, diamonds and spades, the four Tarot suits are **cups**, **swords**, **coins** and **wands**. Each **suit**, and every number within that suit, has a **different** meaning.

Together, several Tarot cards can **combine** to create messages that some people believe give you important **knowledge** about your life.

How do you use Tarot cards?

The best way to use the Tarot is to ask a question, then pick some cards to find the answer. For example, you could ask 'what type of job should I do after I **graduate** high school?', then take a few Tarot cards from the deck to answer your question. If you see 'Justice' or 'Judgement', then maybe the cards are telling you that you would make a great lawyer, or police officer. But if you see 'The Star', then perhaps you should choose a more creative career, and try to do a job making something completely new.

Of course, it probably isn't a good idea to base big life **decisions** on Tarot cards – but you can still use them to **discover** new ideas and **inspiration**. Personally, I **collect** Tarot cards because I love the various art styles of different decks. Since my hobby is **creative writing**, the cards sometimes give me new ideas for stories. Blood types in Japan

In Japan, the most popular way to predict personalities is by using a person's **blood type**. This **system** uses the 4 main blood types like this:





Should we judge people based on their blood type?

Sometimes people in Japan are **discriminated** against because of their blood type. For example, people might vote against a **politician** just because they are not type O, or companies might choose not to hire '**unpredictable**' type ABs. I don't believe in blood type personalities, so I don't think we should **judge** people like this.

The most popular **theory** against blood typing, horoscopes, & tarot is the **Barnum Effect**. This theory describes how **personality** tests pretend to give **specific** advice, but actually use **vague** terms that could apply to anyone. Studies on this can be fun to read! Like a university study where **participants** were given a personality test and asked to rate its **accuracy**. Most people thought it was very accurate, but then the **researchers** revealed that everyone had been given the exact same test results!

Blood donations- a better reason to care about blood types!

1 person's **donation** can save up to 3 lives! And if you're the one getting blood, it's important to know your blood type. **Negative** blood types are very rare. This is **unfortunate** because they can donate to many different people. Some people are also better **suited** to different types of donations. For example, ABs are suited to donating **plasma**. AB plasma is **special**- it can be given to anyone. AB people are rare in Japan, & sometimes disliked because of personality predictions. But for people with rare **diseases**, ABs are amazing! Like the **vtuber** Ironmouse- she needs weekly plasma donations, and has raised thousands of dollars for **charities** that help others just like her. When you are old enough, I hope some of you will **donate** blood!
